

## What is Mango Languages?

Mango Languages is a language learning tool. There are 70 languages to choose from, including Arabic, English, Hindi, Korean, and Spanish. To keep track of your progress, create a free account with your Lincolnwood Library card and an email address.

#### How to access Mango Languages

- 1. Go to the library's website, lincolnwoodlibrary.org
- 2. Hover over **Resources**. Select **Resource Quick Links**.
- 3. Select View Resource to the right of Mango Languages.

Or, you can manually go to <u>connect.mangolanguages.com/</u> <u>lincolnwood/start</u> on any device.

#### Logging in after registering


Follow the **How to access Mango Languages** instructions, then enter your **email address**, your **password**, and select **Log In**.

## Pick a Language

Once logged in, Mango asks you what you want to learn. You can select from the list or type in a search.

Press the menu button and then **Change Language** to switch.

## Overview

Mango organizes language learning into units and chapters. Chapters include learning and practicing words, and listening, reading, and recap exercises. It is best used with a microphone and headphones for speech practice. Select a unit, chapter, and specific exercise to start. Lessons list conversational and grammar goals before you get started.



the language you're learning. Select buttons like **Start**, **Next**, **Back**, **Show Answer**, **Complete** to move through lessons. Listen as the instructors pronounce the new phrases.

#### **Compare voices**

Press the orange microphone button to compare voices with the instructor. Record your voice saying the same phrase to check your pronunciation. You can drag the position to align with the instructor to learn to speak like a native.

#### Notes

Throughout lessons, you may see **culture** and **grammar** notes without pronunciation exercises to help you learn fine points of languages.





After selecting a language, select a **Unit** to learn from, and then pick a specific **Chapter**. Some languages include specialty units like "**Business**" or **"Text Talk**".



In the **Chapter**, select a specific exercise. Select **Goals** to see what the unit covers. Beyond numbered exercises, some chapters have listening, reading, and recap activities. Each activity shows you its goals. Press **?** for a tutorial or **Start** to begin.

Exercises often begin with conversations to study, which start automatically. Current dialogue is highlighted with translations. Select the **Refresh** arrow to hear the whole conversation again, or select the **speaker** icons to the right for a specific part.



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The progress bar at the top of the screen shows how far you are through an exercise, and how many parts it has (7/68 above). Select the X at any time to exit out and save your progress. Drag the slider forward/backward to move through the exercise. Press the? for help and support. Select the gear button for settings.

#### Mobile devices




Google Play Mango Languages is great on mobile devices because of their integrated microphones. It is available from the Apple App Store

and from Google Play. Download and install it like you do other applications.

When you open up the app, it will ask you some questions. You do not have to grant it permissions to send you notifications. We recommend giving it permissions to use your microphone so you can take advantage of the conversational model of Mango.

If you want to change your choice for either of these options, go to your device Settings menu.
